"Dear Mr. Gumbs. I wanted to speak to you on the telephone concerning the talks we had yesterday and today with the representatives of St.Kitts and Nevis. But I have to send you a written message. I think you will be very satisfied with my report. and we are making a pressannouncement about all the talks immediately. As I have always tried to make clear, I see myself Administration to legislate for the formal separation of Anguilla. I therefore feel it important to tell you personally how the "It was careed between the formal separation of anguilla."

" It was agreed between the Minister of State and the Premier that formal constitutional processes would be put into effect to separate Anguilla from the Associated State of the St.Kitts/Nevis/ Anguilla as early as possible in 1980 and to provide for her status as a separate B itish Dependency. This would involve a request and consent motion under Section 9 of the West Indies Act in the State's Legislature and consequential legislation b y the British Government". You will notice at once that I have not set a precise date. Let me explain why, even with the passing of a Resolution under Section 9 of the West Indies Act, there still has to be Parliamentary Legislation here, and this is my difficulty. No one can forecast next year exactily when there will be a suitable occasion for a debate on SKNA. I would not want to promise, say 31 March and then have to break my word because of unforeseen Parliamentary pressures. But you now have a categorical announcement of the Constitutional processes which willbe put in hand. This gives you the assurance of Anguilla#s future status which your Governmentn needs for many reasons, such as the power to raise new revenue, from sources such as coins and stamps, hitherto denied - and I trust it will provide a big boost to the external investment in tourism which I hear with pleasure is beginning to get off the ground. I congratulate you on at last achieving the objective for which Anguillans have been striving for so long. With best wishes Nicholas Ridley". Ends.
