Today we find that almost all the West Indian islands have accepted the fact that trade two years in succession unionism and politics must be separate and that 1960 and 1961. persons cannot hold dual posts if there is not to be a disastrous result. The sole exception to this is St. Kitts where the members of Government keep their trade union posts and are effectively destroying both the Union and the State.

Especially now with proposed developments involving Governmental assistance, it is clear that Government cannot negotiate against its own interests. Thus we have already seen the workers at Frigate Bay kept down to the Government rate of pay because of the insistence of the trace union which is manned by the Government. Let us hope that 1968 will be the last year to see the total equation of the Government and Union and that next year the workers will demand that there be a severance of the two, as has recently occurred in Antigua.
