The written invitation to Secretary General Thant was carried here by Jeremiah Gumbs, who denied the allegations. The message was signed by Ronald Web-ter, who was named President in 1967 when Anguilla declared independence from the British-sponsored federation linking it with St. Kitts and Nevis.

Mr. Gumbs said that as a witness, he challenged an account given by William Whitlock, British Parliamentary Under Secretary at the Foreign and Commonwealth Office, of how he had teen driven off the island Tuesday by gunfire.

Mr. Whitlock charged in London yesterday that Mafiatype elements controlled Anguilla and that the 6,000 islanders feared they sought to set up gambling casinos on the 35 square-mile island 150 miles east of Puerto Rico.

#### Coup Attempt Charged

Mr. Gumbs charged that Mr. Whitlock and a few associates had sought to take over control of the island and install Anthony Lee as a resident commissioner.

"It was a coup that failed," he said.

Mr. Gumbs urged that the United Nations send a factfinding mission to the island. "The Anguillans are a Christian, church going people who do not want gambling casi nos," he add d.

Mr. Gumbs disputed the British official's report that he had been warmly welcomed to Anguilla and his proposals




