EDITORIAL. Two years ago, Statehood was being forced upon us. It was all done in a rush, and no one explained to us what it was going to involve. Mr. Adams went to London and signed a paper and Anguilla legally became part of the Associated State. When Anguillans woke up and realised what had happened, they protested, and under the glorious leadership of Mr. Ronald Webster, began to get free from St. Kitts. Now the same sort of thing seem to be happening, again, London seem to know *and* St. Kitts seem to know that Anguilla is going to declare her independence from Britain. Are we again being rushed into something, as in Statehood? Are there not better means of getting recognition of our separation from St. Kitts, than using the same methods that got us mixed up with Statehood? On July 11th last year, we held a referendum for the people to decide if they wanted separation from St. Kitts and they unanimously agreed. They would no doubt vote the same way today. Any decision to take Anguilla out of the Commonwealth, should be agreed upon by the Council and then put to the people in a referendum. The Editor of the BEACON is not afraid to take on the responsibilities of Independence, but we must be convinced that all other means to achieve our goal are exhausted, and the responsibilities of being an Independent Country must be realised and told to the people before such a step is taken. We feel, as do other nations that these responsibilities to resolve this dispute are H.M.G.'s, and we are mad with H.M.G. for the way she handled the situation, and feel that more should have been done. We can imagine that if and when H.M.G. does act, she wants the backing of the other Commonwealth Countries. We know how these Countries feel about us. These same leaders will be meeting in London on the 7th Jan. and this will give H.M.G. a chance to get their support in whatever action she decides to take. We think we should wait for the report of this conference, we have no reason to panic at this stage. A letter in last week's issue written by "Worried Anguillan" is right about the facts, but wrong in the conclusion drawn from them. There is no doubt that rumours are widespread in the press, that Anguilla is going to declare her independence from Britain, also it is true that certain people are actively campaigning for this. How a rumour of a declaration of Independence got about, we do not know, it may have been a reporter's misunderstanding of Mr. Ronald Webster, in an interview or it may be a big bluff on Mr. Webster's part to try and force Britain's hand. We know a vast majority of Anguillans are pro-British. We have no quarrel with Britain, even though we are disappointed with her for not taking a stronger ^{line} with St. Kitts. As we said before, any declaration of Independence from Britain, is a serious matter, with a lot of complications, and should be looked into seriously, and the people should be told what to expect in such an event.

ANGUILLA'S LEGITIMATE CLAIM TO SELF DETERMINATION. (By An Anguillan)

The great Nations of the World-U.S.A., France, U.S.S.R., Venezuela among others, have striven from colonialism or oppression to developed and International prominence, because their peoples objected to former domination by alien or foreign powers. This was done through the most undemocratic ways one can think of, and has brought into the English Language the word (to all freedom loving people of this modern era) which is most hated-ILLEGALITY.

Be this as it may, that urge or desire to be free, is human, and therefore, where this determination is upper-most, be the country large or small, this desire continues to make itself known. Anguilla is no exception to the rule as the events of the last eighteen months have shown.

Anguilla, the Pearl of the Caribbean has been obscured for hundreds of years. No small wonder that fellow West Indians, did not know about Anguilla and less so the Ministers of Her Majesty's Gov't at Whitehall.

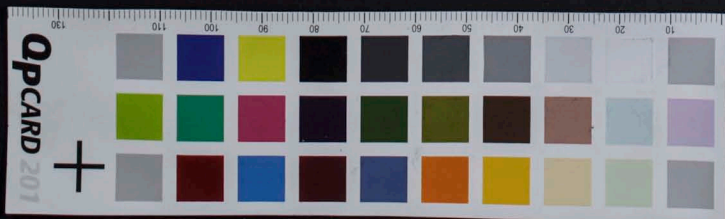
This has been the state of affairs prior to that memorable day, May 30th 1968, when the world was brought face to face with a problem, which has since then baffled even the great legislators of the world's most advanced Democratic Institution at Whitehall- Anguilla's LEGITIMATE claim to Self-determination. For once the British Parliament have learnt by experience-the truly great educator- that Constitutions are drawn up for people and NOT people for constitutions. Many of the world's leading politicians past and present, emerged from obscurity to prominence, leaving their names indelibly engraven on the page of history. Anguillans and their God-fearing leader, Mr. Ronald Webster have begun a chapter in history, which, given our legitimate chance, will, with the help of the Omnipotent, leave the pages of history equally indelibly engraven.

Anguilla's determination can be verified in the Atlantic Charter, drawn up at Placentia Bay, Newfoundland, August 9th through 11th, 1941, Here, two of world's leading figures, the late President, Franklyn Delano Roosevelt and the late, the Rt. Hon. Sir Winston Leonard Spencer Churchill, drew up the United Nations Charter, the foundation of the World's highest International Organisation. Here is part of the text of this document which verifies Anguilla's legitimate claim to self-determination, and I quote: Paragraphs 3 and 8. "We" at the beginning of each paragraph stands for President Roosevelt, speaking for the U.S.A. and Mr. Churchill speaking for Great Britain.

- (3) We believe that all PEOPLES have the RIGHT to choose the form of Government under which they shall live.
- (8) We believe that both because it is right and because it is common-sense all nations must learn to settle their disputes by agreement and not by force, and that countries which build up great armaments to threaten other countries must be disarmed.

We the people of Anguilla do hereby, by the will of the Almighty God ask the Governments of the United States of America and Great Britain to honour the commitment of their illustrious dead, in making it clear to all tyrants, including the infamous Bradshaw to free Anguillans, the beloved children of God. If this is not done peaceably, be it known to the Central Government of St. Kitts-Nevis, Her Majesty's Government and the World, that a new and dangerous conflagration will flare up endangering the peace of the world, because, we Anguillans will, so help us God, defend our island home, whatever the cost may be. Let me end by exhorting fellow Anguillas to pray fervently to God their maker, to be ready to defend their God-given freedoms, worship, expression and liberty-fearing none other but God Almighty our only Mediator and Advocate.

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OPEN LETTER TO THE ANGUILLA GOVERNMENT.

My fellow citizens, the war is not over nor is the battle won. This is the time that every man, woman and child must determine their own future. It is not the consciousness of men which determines their consciousness. Knowledge is the beginning of freedom and unity is its foundation. Let us remain united to protect and lead the land we love, let us build a prosperous future not only for ourselves but for the generations that follow. We shall fight to defend our beaches, our land and our freedom. The time has come for us to recover from the anaesthetic of retrogression and oppression. Let us drink from the oasis the waters of unity, after having passed through the hot sun and burning sands of tyranny and trepidation. The voice of the people, their aims, their desires and their suggestions must be given special attention. The greatest enemy is here in Anguilla. I see the affliction of an innocent people; I see a people being robbed for others to live in splendour and luxury. The government should be much concerned about the social, economical, educational and political desires of the people. Why should the Government give the shopkeeper the active opportunity to victimize his fellow creatures? Tourists can't afford to live comfortably with the present prices. I admonish the Government to look at our need and put the Check and Balance system into operation. This has been going on too long and must be stopped NOW. What is the ordinary man doing about it? Do something constructively that will help to ameliorate the standard of living. It is no use sitting back and lamenting. Were the people of Anguilla created to suffer? Already two classes are developing - the rich and the poor. This is very serious indeed. With the Russian Revolution trouble began when irregularities in the food supply led to street disorders in the Capital City. The Causes of the French Revolution are similar. Why not make alcohol a luxury rather than food and clothing? When the Governments of every nation endeavour to limit the rise of prices and lower the cost of living, they realise that there is a conception of a just price which stands above that evolved from the blind caprice of the law of Supply and Demand and that the higher law ought to prevail. These high prices affects the individual's education. Should the Government call a meeting of all shop owners and discuss this urgent matter or should they sit back and let injustice continue? If the prices are not lowered the labourer should have an increase in wages to meet the demands. It is a cry, a desire, a thirst, a necessity. Some will die while others live.

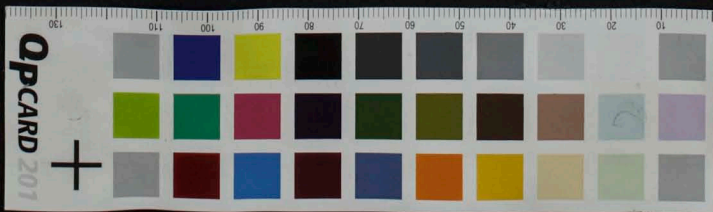
other British Caribbean Countries. St. Kitts lacks the forces necessary to subdue the Anguillans, and Britain has been reluctant to provide them because of the lack of support from Jamaica, Barbados, Trinidad and Guyana. If Britain also refuses to yield to Anguilla, the British Representative Mr. Lee will be asked to leave in January, Mr. Webster said, adding "We have plans which we are prepared to execute if the deadline is not met". He would not reveal the plans, but left open the possibility that Anguilla might revert to going a republic, perhaps linking up with other islands.

LETTER TO BRADSHAW (By A Born Anguillan)

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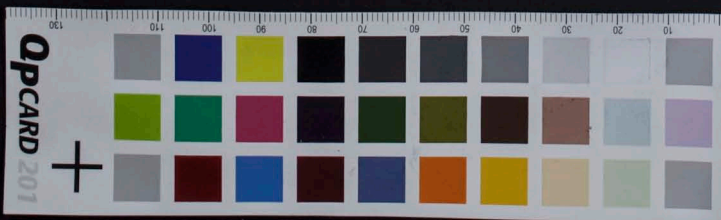

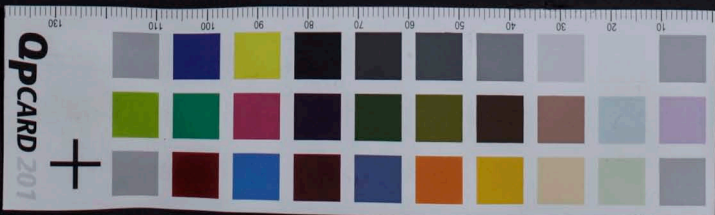

As an example of renewed interest in the British press on the subject of Anguilla, we publish a recent article in the London Times by Henry Giniger

"No longer completely independent, but still independent minded, the 6000 inhabitants of the 35 square mile island of Abguilla have just issued a virtual ultimatum to Britain. This may be of little concern in London, but a visitor to Anguilla finds the same strong feelings that existed more than a year and a half ago, when the island rebelled against the domination of St.Kitts and declared itself a republic. This upsurge of nationalism which aroused much sympathy and interest the world, has subsided to a point where the Union Jack is flying alongside the Anguilla Flag, and the official letterheads speak merely of the "Government of Anguilla." It is a De Facto Government formed by a Council of seven led by the island's leading businessman, Mr. Ronald Webster, who was once "President of Anguilla", but has now down-graded himself to Chief Executive Officer and Chairman of the Council. Britain has refused to give formal recognition to this government or to disturb the constitutional arrangements under which the Associated State of St.Kitts, Nevis, Anguilla was formed. However, unable to persuade the Anguillans to accept the authority of the unpopular St.Kitts' Government, led by Mr. Robert Bradshaw the Prime Minister, Britain bought time by declaring an interim period beginning last January. The interim period ends on January 8th. Last month when he went to London Mr.Webster said it would not be renewed unless Britain made what would be in effect a start toward recognizing Anguilla as a separate entity. In the name of the Council he asked that by Dec:15th a judicial system should be instituted with the appointment of a magistrate who would also serve as a registrar for various legal acts. The Anguillans demanded that certain of their funds held in the Banks at St.Kitts and blocked by the St.Kitts' Government since the revolt, should be released and payment of salaries and pensions be resumed. The demands were made

formally in a letter dated November 7th, copies of which were sent to Cont'd on page 3.

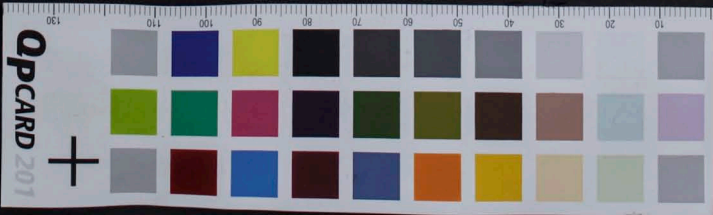
