#### ELECTED UNOPPOSED:

The Candidates for President -- Vice President, Mr. Ronald Webster and Campbell Fleming respectively, were declared "Elected Unopposed" by the supervisor of the Election, Mr. Rapheal Lake. Nomination day was on Feb. 21st. Mr. Webster is Chairman of the Anguilla Council and Chief Executive of Anguilla. Mr. Webster first held the post as president of Anguilla when Mr. Peter Adams stepped down as Anguilla's first president in August 1967, but later relinquished that post for the Interim agreement that ended on 8th Jan. this year. Mr. Webster has chosen Mr. Campbell Fleming, a Government employee at the Cottage Hospital as the No. 2 man of the island, Mr. Fleming is also present secretary to the Council. (Con't en page §).

As a representative of the Methodist Church of South Carolina, I would like to thank the people of Anguilla for their many acts of hospitality. Speaking for the Doctors who have been here previously, and those yet to come, I would like to pass on a bit of information to attract and support a permanent Doctor here in Anguilla.

1. Fees seem rather high, and there may be some need for adjustment, although \$5.00 B.W.I. is half what similar services would cost in low income areas of the U.S.A. Cakes, Beer, Shoes, and many other things cost more here than in the States. It is important that fees be established and stable, to attract a qualified Physician. (Con't on page **%**).

The leader seeking to achieve ends does not shut his eyes to dangers. We will give our lives because we have build Anguilla to what it is without aid from the Queen or Mr. Bradshaw. Our help came from the French and Dutch islands, the U.S. Virgin Islands and if they were in our shoes they would do the same as we are doing. I once boast of being British subject, but now, I am glad for what I am. I am ashamed to see that a great Nation like England thinks so little of her people that she would not even listen to their cry. If England was interested things would not have gone where it is today. I would like H.M.G. to think about it, but not to try using force in Anguilla or encouraging it. I will try and send a copy of this to all of those that are condeming Anguilla; I will say to them they are afraid we come from 2,000 years behind and left them there. In closing I would like to repeat what some Anguillans said, it belongs to us and we will not enter the dark age again. We are in the light to stay. This is my opinion not subject to anyone, death before my people return to hell. Do you see whats happening there in St. Kitts today? Can not H.M.G.see?

EDITORIAL:

Checking back on the days that are now history, even though they are just over two years ago, readers to the Democrat would have read a few articles by the Editor of this paper. These articles were primarily to bring to the attention of Anguillans, the advantages that were taken of them by the Government of St.Kitts. They

also served to teach the Government of St.Kitts, that Anguillans were not to be taken for granted any longer. At one time, one of these articles served to teach Mr.Southwell, the Deputy Premier of St.Kitts, part of the Constitution he signed in England. That was when he got over Government controlled radio station ZIZ and announced that Mr.Peter Adams, then Anguilla's representative to the House of Assembly could not resign from his post. I had only to refer him to the section of the Constitution where it made provision for any member to resign in the manner in which Mr. Adams did. Those days are long gone, since that we have published our views in the columns of the BEACON, without favour to any party. We have criticised the Government of England, St.Kitts and that of Anguilla, of which I am a part, when I find it necessary.

The Constitution of the Republic of Anguilla, is only 15 Articles with 19 Sections in The Loupes Article. While it is true that some of the Sections will not be understood by all, it is expected that members of the Government and future politicians would make sure that they understand and comply with every section. Yet we find a situation where the Vice-President Elect, Campbell Fleming has not met the requirements to qualify as a candidate. It specifically says in Section 6 Article 7, that NO person shall qualify as a candidate unless he or she is free of Civil Employment (except as an Incumbant) which we presume is miss spelt for "Incumbent", and at that Mr. Fleming does not qualify. Mr. Fleming is employed by the Government as a Maintenance Officer at the Cottage Hospital, and drew his salary up to the end of this month, and yet he was registered as a candidate for the office of Vice-President on Feb. 21st. The President Elect, Ronald Webster who chose Mr. Fleming as his running mate, should realize that this could have been a serious matter if there was an opposition party. It could have seriously meant the disqualification of Mr. Webster as president as his running mate did not qualify, which would have deprived Anguillans of the man they wanted to represent them. Little things like these have very serious implications and should not be overlooked. You don't have to be a qualified Lawyer to notice these things, though you can be a Lawyer without qualifications. Mr. Fleming should have publicly resigned from the Civil Service to announce his candidacy.



THE BEACON

We have received the third production of the Conch Shell, the bulletin of the Friends of Anguilla in Britain. It states there, that the Postmaster General in Britain has been instructed to return to sehder all mail that is addressed to Anguilla. They advise that care should be taken that the name ANGUILLA does not appear on the address of any letter, but that the routes via St. Thomas or St. Martin can still be used. We suggest that an address-such as " The Valley. c/o Box 42, Marigot, St. Martin" should ensure a letter being delivered here. Perhaps "Scrub Island" via St. Thomas might also work. As we stated last week, Britain at the same time forwarded a request to the Universal Postal Union, that mail from Anguilla bearing the Anguilla stamp should not be delivered. So far there has been no announcement that this action has been taken. Z.I.Z. would certainly have announced it. So it appears that the U P U is taking a more charitable " view of Anguilla's postal needs than is H M G in Britain.

the M.V. Poqui in vain. Other attempts to get tugs from Puerto Rico, St. Thomas and Antigua were without success. A Japanese fishing boat that was nearby, promised to help, but never turned up. Because of the high seas which persisted the vessel lay there until Tuesday afternoon, when she was refloated with the help of Bulldozers. Mr. Gumbs said that the boat is leaking but he has it under control. The Warspite is one of the oldest vessels of Anguilla. She was depicted on the 25¢ starp, of the special issue of Nov. 11th. last year, commemorating Anguilla's Ship building. She also does the fortnightly trip to Sombrero, servicing the Light House there. The MAID OF ANGUILLA, Passenger boat that runs between Anguilla and St. Martin struck a reef going out of "Little Harbour", sprang a leak and sunk. On board the motor boat was the owner David Hodge of George Hill and a woman. It is reported that the gear slipped out and Hodge went below to reengage the gear. When he got back on deck, the boat struck a reef in the narrow channel. She soon sunk and lay on the reef. Attempts to salvage the boat is going on. In other boat news, it is reported that the Betsy, on her last-trip from Trinidad, was struck by a yacht which carried away her Bow-sprit. The Betsy, owned by Clement Daniels arrived in Anguilla on Sun. 23rd. Febr. without her Bow-sprit.

RUTH 16.It is now reliably reported that the Ruth 16 is in Venezuela. The owner Mrs. Ruth Goodnow received a cable to the effect that all was well. The Ruth left Anguilla on Jan. 9th. for Grenada, but nothing was heard of her whereabouts until now. It is believed that the boat developed engine

trouble and drifted to Venezuela.

He is the elder in the Seventh Day Adventist Church to which Mr. Webster also belongs. Also elected un-opposed are the "Senior District Representatives". They were declared elected on 29th. Febr. 1969 after no other reandidates registered to contest the seats. They are Messrs. Lucas Wilson and Winston Harrigan, for district 1, James Woods and Uriel Sasso for district 2, Mac Connor and Charles Fleming for district 3. It is reported that these are the men chosen by President Elect Ronald Webster to control the seats. Mr. Camile Connor of South Hill, intended to be a candidate but he withdrew. Mr. Connor told us that his official reason for with-drawing was his mis-understanding of the whole situation. Nomination Day for the "National Representatives" will be on March 12th. 1969.

coubled with heavy seas, a link of the anchor chain was broken. The vessel drifted eastward and lay almost broadside on the south side of the pier.
